

# **REPORT ON THE 8<sup>TH</sup> CARIBBEAN INTERNET GOVERNANCE FORUM (8CIGF)**

**Dates:** 29 to 30 August 2012

**Venue:** Bay Gardens Hotel, Rodney Bay, St. Lucia

## **Background and Objectives**

The Caribbean Internet Governance Forum (CIGF) is a multi-country, multi-stakeholder forum initiated by the Caribbean Telecommunications Union (CTU) and the Caribbean Community (CARICOM) Secretariat in 2005 to coordinate a regional approach to Internet Governance. The forum has since met annually and the primary product of its work has been the formulation of a Caribbean Internet Governance Policy Framework issued in 2009. This policy framework articulates a Caribbean vision, priority areas and recommendations for Internet Governance and serves as a guide for regional stakeholders. The CTU has been actively implementing projects in accordance with the document to ensure that Caribbean citizens are able to make effective use of the Internet.

In convening the 8<sup>th</sup> CIGF, the CTU targeted the broadest range of Internet stakeholders including Government policy-makers, regulators, Internet service providers, telecommunications operators, businesses/private sector, international organisations, academic institutions and civil society Internet users. The forum addressed the following objectives via a series of presentation, discussion and workshop sessions, led or facilitated by respected regional or international specialists and practitioners:

- Highlighting priority Internet Governance issues for the Caribbean
- Reviewing progress since the 7<sup>th</sup> CIGF in 2011
- Presenting a business case for advancing the proliferation of Caribbean Internet Exchange Points
- Outlining the need for a comprehensive Cyber-Security Framework
- Reviewing and revising the Caribbean Internet Governance Policy Framework
- Planning future policy development and collaboration work.

## **Summary of Forum Proceedings**

The 8<sup>th</sup> CIGF had over 80 registered participants on site representing all the targeted stakeholder groups, mostly from St. Lucia but also from Belize, Jamaica, Cayman Islands, St. Maarten, Montserrat, Antigua/Barbuda, Barbados, Trinidad/Tobago, Aruba as well as speakers from the USA, Argentina, Uruguay and Canada. There was Ministerial level representation from the Cayman Islands and the host country, St. Lucia. There were also an additional 60 participants on-line from 23 countries, including 9 CTU member territories, 5 other countries from North, Central and South America (USA, Mexico, Costa Rica, Colombia and Venezuela), 3 from Europe – the UK, Malta and Armenia - and others as far flung as India, Bangladesh, Papua-New Guinea, Samoa and Fiji.

The forum saw a series of informative presentations consistent with the forum objectives. The sessions on cyber-security (a special focus of the CTU for 2012) and Internet exchange points were particularly well received. On-site participants also actively and successfully participated in workshop sessions which produced valuable input to the second issue of the Caribbean Internet Governance Policy Framework, scheduled for January 2013. The CTU planned to continue and revitalise the on-line aspect of the CIGF to progress discussions, consensus and capacity building on all Internet governance issues in the region in the interim between live CIGF sessions.

Feedback from participants was quite favourable regarding their experience of the 8<sup>th</sup> CIGF with the on-line participants reporting consistently good stream quality and being especially grateful for the opportunity to participate meaningfully, as many of their comments and questions were addressed on the conference floor.

As indicated, the CTU's web site and an updated mailing list inclusive of the 8<sup>th</sup> CIGF participants would be used to facilitate further collaboration among stakeholders for development and publishing of Issue 2 of the CIGPF as well as for ongoing ventilation of IG issues. All were urged to continue active participation through Q4 2012, including following the 7<sup>th</sup> global Internet Governance Forum in November 2012 towards supporting update and issuance of the updated CIGPF by January 2013.
