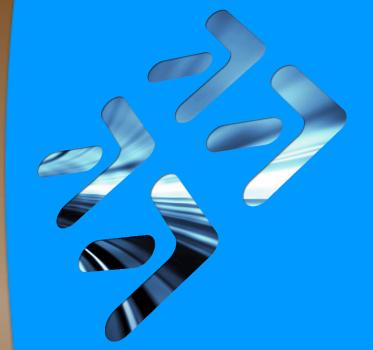

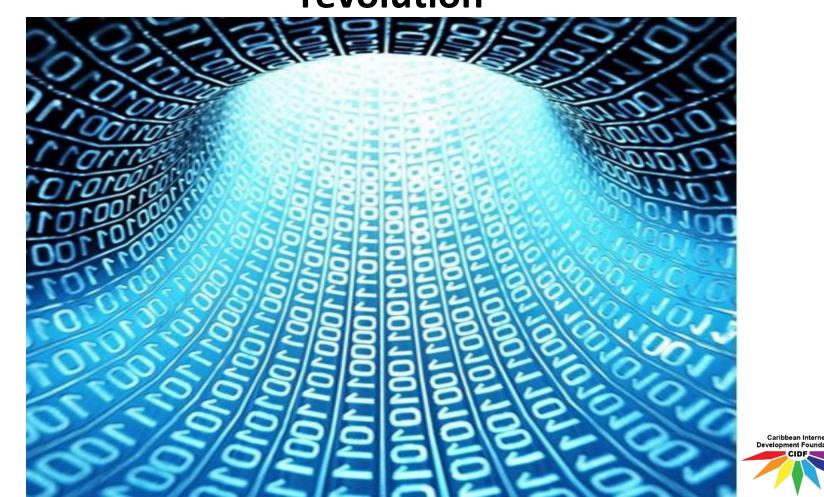

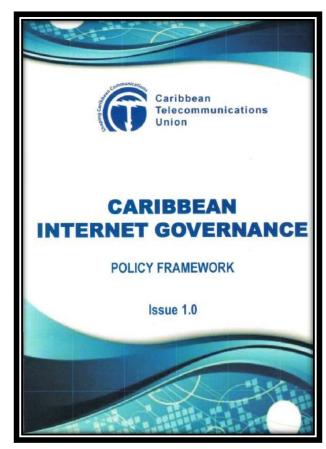

Establish critical internet infrastructure





CIGF Challenges - I

Insufficient attention /visibility to IG at the National level.

Limited reach /impact of the regional work at the national level.

Lack of capacity/organization nationally to benefit from CIGF and to address National IG Issues.



CIGF Challenges - II

Dearth of skills and work pathway for advocacy on IG.

Disconnect between regional and national initiatives

Insufficient capacity of the persons working in the area to represent their countries at international Internet fora or to execute IG related activities.

Multiplicity of uncoordinated interventions.





Rationale for the CIDF

There is a continuing need to:

- Create awareness and educate
- Build expertise on Internet governance and digital transformation issues.
- Coordinate Caribbean IG activities at the national level.

The CIDF will enable us to realise the Internet's huge potential and transform the region.

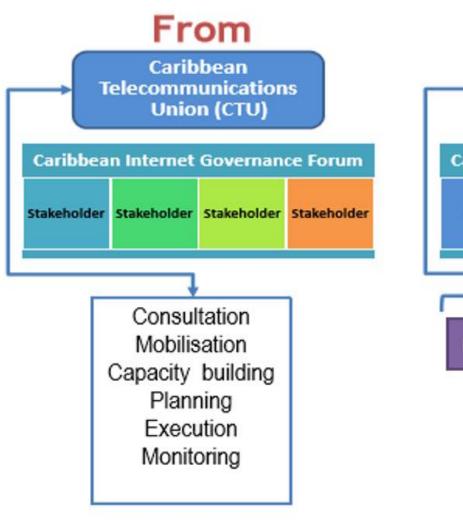


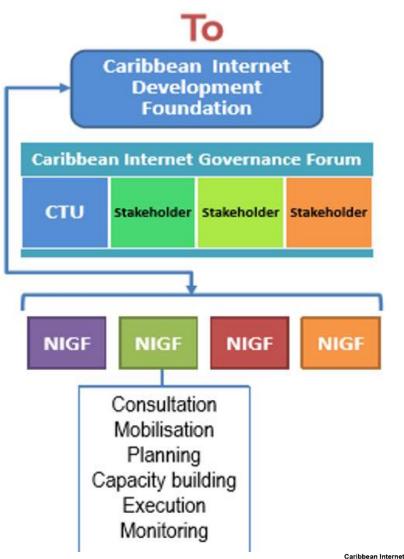
Objectives of the CIDF

- Convene the annual CIGF
- Coordinate the regional activities associated with IG and digital transformation.
- Support the establishment of national IGF.
- Link regional IG activities to national initiatives.
- Mobilize national multi-stakeholder communities of interest to execute IG project.
- Train to execute specific mandates.
- Development of professionals who can effectively represent national interests at international IG fora.
